- WHEREAS:** Thousands of brave Minnesotans have demonstrated courage and commitment to freedom by serving in the Armed Forces of the United States of America in active duty posts to Afghanistan, Iraq, and around the world; and
- WHEREAS:** More than 40 percent of military personnel have children who are left behind during deployments; and
- WHEREAS:** More than 15,000 children in Minnesota have at least one parent currently serving in active military duty; and
- WHEREAS:** These children are a source of pride and it is fitting that we recognize and honor their sacrifices, celebrate their spirit, and let our men and women in uniform know that while they are taking care of us, we are taking care of their children; and
- WHEREAS:** By recognizing the Month of the Military Child, we pay tribute to military children for their commitment, their struggles, and their unconditional support of our troops, because when parents serve in the military, their kids are heroes too.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK DAYTON, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of April, 2011 as:
